



FBCOS ACTS DISCIPLESHIP PROCESS

ACCEPT

Step 1: Accept Christ as Personal Savior

The Holy Spirit convicts a person to Accept Jesus Christ as personal Savior. This is the foundation upon which the discipleship process is built.

Examples of efforts for accomplishing this: Personal Witnessing, Worship Services, Community Outreach Events, Targeted Evangelism Activities

CONNECT

Step 2: Connect with God through the life of the Church and personal relationships.

Christians engage in a daily walk with Christ by practicing spiritual disciplines and encouraging others.

Examples of efforts for accomplishing this: Personal Witnessing and Mentoring, Worship Services, Prayer, Encouragement and Accountability, Sunday School (Connection Groups), Small Group Bible Studies

TRAIN

Step 3: Train believers to disciple effectively and equip them to mature spiritually.

Maturing Christians mentor, train, and equip other Christians to intentionally mature spiritually. Discipleship occurs as believers gain wisdom and a deeper knowledge of their role in ministry by applying the truths of God's Word daily.

Examples of efforts for accomplishing this: Sunday School (Connection Groups), Specific Discipleship Study Groups, Evangelism Classes, Personal Witnessing

SHARE

Step 4: Share God's Word that others may Accept Christ as Personal Savior.

Christians obey the Great Commission by sharing their God-given gifts, passions, abilities and testimony to lead others to know and follow Christ.

Examples of efforts for accomplishing this: Personal Witnessing, Lay Ministers, Individual and Group Ministries, Community and Beyond Mission Efforts
